FROM THE COUNCIL

Pastor will lead chapel at Pleasant Acres today at 2:15 PM.

The consistory approved the baptism requests of Mr. and Mrs. Matt Brummel for their son, Lincoln James, of Mr. and Mrs. Peter Brummel for their daughter, Ellowyn Harper, and of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Andringa for their daughter, Nora Jae. The baptism of Lincoln and Ellowyn will take place next Sunday morning, September 22, Lord willing. The consistory approved the request of the Andringas that Prof. Dykstra administer the

sacrament his granddaughter Nora on Sunday morning September 29. Prof. Dykstra has agreed to preach both services in Calvary on September 29 due to our pastor being busy with Classis West that week.

Call to Worship: The congregation is called to a special worship service on Tuesday, September 24, at 7:00 p.m. in connection with Classis West's examination of Pastor-Elect Matt Kortus. Mr. Kortus will be leading the worship service. The collection will be received for the PR Scholarship fund, a collection originally scheduled for December 15. Nursery attendants will be Courtney D, Tonia W, and Tatum B.

The church visitors of Classis West plan to meet with Calvary's council on Tuesday, September 24, after the worship service that evening.

The council announces with thanksgiving to God that the parsonage mortgage has been paid off. All building fund collections will now go toward the church mortgage which has a balance of \$221,147. The upcoming collection scheduled for September 29 for the New Parsonage Fund will now be cancelled, and collections will be received instead for the Beacon Lights and Wingham PR School, (collections that were originally scheduled for October 6 and November 3, respectively). The evening offerings on October 6 and November 3 will now be only for the Building Fund.

With thankfulness to God, the offerings for the month of August were: General Fund \$23,819.50, Building Fund \$6,901.23, Benevolent Fund \$2,091.55, Hull PRC School \$7,676.50, Trinity Christian High School \$3,675.25, Foreign Missions \$411.75, Calvary Evangelism Committee \$385.75, Protestant Reformed Special Education \$346.50, and Domestic Missions \$295.50.

DENOMINATIONAL NEWS

Candidate Matt Kortus accepted the call from Hope PRC in Redlands, CA and declined the call from Immanuel PRC in Lacombe, AB.

Classis West will meet in regular session on September 25 at Calvary PRC to treat a lengthy agenda in addition to the examination of Pastor-elect Matt Kortus. Pastor Brummel and Elder Glenn Kooima are the delegates from our consistory.

Classis East met for two days this past week. Pastor-elect Jacob Maatman sustained his classical exam and Southeast PRC was advised to proceed to his ordination. Classis approved the organization of a new congregation (to be called Unity PRC). Approval was given for the emeritation of Rev. Michael DeVries effective January 1, 2020 after 41 years of faithful service at five PR congregations. Approval was given in a matter of discipline. In addition, Classis treated six appeals and protests and one overture, adopted a pulpit supply schedule, and appointed a moderator for Kalamazoo PRC.

With great joy Southeast PRC celebrates Pastor-elect Maatman's successful examination by Classis East and authorization to proceed with his ordination. His ordination and installation into the gospel ministry as the next pastor of Southeast PRC is scheduled for Friday evening, September 27, 7:00 PM, at Southwest Protestant Reformed Church. Prof. David Engelsma will officiate.
