## **FROM THE COUNCIL**

We welcome Rev. Laning to our pulpit this morning. A pulpit switch was requested by Hull PRC due to their pastor's involvement in Synod this past week. Our pastor is preaching for Hull this morning.

The council approved opening each worship service to the entire congregation while yet maintaining social distancing. Those who are showing any symptoms of Covid-19 or who are sick are encouraged to remain home with their families and watch the livestream. Ushers will be available to help best utilize the space available. As you exit the

worship services, you are asked to do so slowly and carefully with respect toward those around you.

Those seated on the west side of the sanctuary and narthex are asked to exit out of the west doors, those in the center out the center doors, and those on the east side out of the east doors. As you exit the front doors of the church building, please keep moving past the canopy in order to allow others to exit the building and make it to their vehicles.

The council decided to keep the doors closed and have the members open them when they arrive prior to the service due to the heat and flies.

Printed copies of the bulletins and outlines will be available in church from the ushers.

Collections will be received the same way as we have been doing with the offering plates located in the fellowship hall. The congregation is encouraged to only place in the offering baskets the offerings for that worship service. All loose funds in the morning will go to the General Fund. Loose funds in the evening service will go toward the offering which is being collected, and in the case of multiple offerings, the funds will be split between the two.

While we rejoice in the opportunity again to worship as a congregation, we also realize that this decision may cause others to not feel comfortable in worship. Please remember in prayer those members who for age or health reasons are unable to gather with us in the sanctuary on the Lord's Day.
